**Décor:** Make use of what you already have. Be creative with your eco-friendly decorations. Decorate with your own recyclable or reusable items. Use colourful biodegradable balloons and ribbons. Use paper streamers and paper pom poms and lanterns that you can use after the party, or fabric bunting. Party hats and banners can be made from old cardboard, coloured wrapper or with a cloth.

**Invitations:** Recycled paper invitations are one of the choices, but they are not the only choice. You can reuse old greeting cards. **Shop Local:** Whether it is decor or food, there are items that can be sourced from local farmers and entrepreneurs. Buy organic fruit and veg from the local farmers' market and try to make your own party cake.

**Lighting:** Use energy-efficient lights -LED or CFL. Opt for outdoor lights with LED or CFL light bulbs, that may be solar-powered, and are low maintenance and safe. Whenever possible, opt for natural light.

**Dishes and Table Ware:** Do not buy disposable party plates and cutlery, instead look for biodegradable tableware or stronger plastic pieces that can be washed up. Plastic and paper tableware may seem easier to use, but they often generate a lot of waste because of its single use. If reusable items do not suit your needs, buy plates, cups, and cutlery made from bamboo or another environmentally friendly option.

**Plan for zero waste menu:** Create a menu that is completely waste-free. Opt for food without plastic packaging. If doing a potluck-style party, ask guests to bring their meals in glass serving bowls and dishes with lids.

**Manage leftover food:** Try to choose menu items that include the basic ingredients you would normally purchase for your everyday menus. So leftovers can be frozen for use at a later date. It can be packed off to friends and relatives also. If you have excess food, there are many NGOs, they collect excess food and give it to people who really need it.













**Gifts:** Keep a 'no plastic' theme and wrap all gifts in old newspapers, used wrappers or recyclable paper. You can make your gift more special by
